NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener intends to designate the property at the following municipal address as a property of historical value under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

The subject property is located at 73 Queen Street North, and is owned by the Regional Municipality of Waterloo. It is intended that only the exterior of the Waterloo County Jail and Governor's House will be designated.

The designation described herein is recommended due to the fact that the Waterloo County Jail is the oldest existing government building in Kitchener, in recognition of the fact that the jail represents the appointment of Kitchener, then Berlin, as a county seat which led the way to the growth of wealth and industry in this area, and because the Governor's House has been an integral part of the Waterloo County Jail for over 100 years.

Any person may, within thirty days of the first publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the City of Kitchener notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Kitchener shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
