## THE CORPORATION OF THE BOROUGH OF SCARBOROUGH



to designate Armadale Free Methodist Church on the north side Passmore Avenue west of Markham Road as being of historical and architectural value.

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974. S.O. Chapter 122, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate a real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest; and

WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the Borough of Scarborough has caused to be served upon the owners of the lands and premises known as "Armadale Free Methodist Church" municipally known as Part Lot 19 Concession 5 (n/s Passmore Avenue west of Markham Road) and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and

WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "B" hereto! and

WHEREAS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE BOROUGH OF SCARBOROUGH ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. There is designated as being of architectural value or interest the real property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as "Armadale Free Methodist Church" known municipally as Part Lot 19 Concession 5 (N/S Passmore Avenue west of Markham Road).
- 2. The Borough Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper land registry office.
- The Borough Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the Borough of Scarborough.

## SCHEDULE "A" - By-law 19128

Legal Description:

"Armadale Free Methodist Church", municipally known as Part Lot 19 Concession 5 (N/S Passmore Avenue west of Markham Road)

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Borough of Scarborough in the Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto, being composed of that part of Lot 19 in Concession V of the said Borough designated as PART 1 on a Reference Plan deposited in the Registry Office for the Registry Division of Toronto Boroughs and York South as 64R-8267.

## SCHEDULE "B" - By-law 19128



Reasons for the designation of "Armadale Free Methodist Church",
Part Lot 19 Concession 5 (N/S Passmore Avenue west of Markham
Road)

"Armadale Free Methodist Church". This church is recommended for designation for both historical and architectural reasons. It is historically significant as the oldest continuing Free Methodist place of worship in Canada. A plain frame building of board and batten construction erected in 1880, it is a good example of Canadian carpenters' Gothic church architecture produced by voluntary labour in a rural community.
