BY-LAW NUMBER 24544



to designate the Secor Family Burial Plot as being of historical and architectural value

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18 as amended, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historical and architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Scarborough has caused to be served upon the owners of the lands and premises known as the Secor Family Burial Plot, a property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF SCARBOROUGH ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as Secor Family Burial Plot, is hereby designated as being of historical and

architectural value or interest.

- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry office.
- 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Scarborough.

SCHEDULE "A" TO BY-LAW 24544

DESCRIPTION OF LAND

Part Lot 18, Concession D, in the City of Scarborough in the Municipality of

Metropolitan Toronto, now designated as Part 1 on Plan 64R-14703 and Parcel D-1,

Section M-755, being Block D, Plan M-755, now designated as Part 2 on Plan 66R-

16993.

TYPE: Designation under The Ontario Heritage Act.

SCHEDULE "B" TO BY-LAW 24544

REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION OF THE "SECOR FAMILY BURIAL PLOT"

Secor Family Burial Plot is recommended for designation for historical reasons, being the final resting place for members of one of Scarborough's early pioneer family members, including Scarborough's first Reeve, Peter Secor. The designation includes a large cairn erected in 1938 which contains those flat monuments uncovered at that time. These markers have been mounted into the vertical sides of the cairn with the inscriptions exposed.
