NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Kingsville intends to designate, under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, the property legally described as Part of Lot 1, First Concession known municipally as 98 Main Street East in the Town of Kingsville in the Province of Ontario.

REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

Built in 1905 the Wedding House represents the academic architectural style of Queen Anne Revival, remains structurally unchanged from its original construction, and occupies its original location. Its distinctive features include a fieldstone foundation, gingerbread scroll, circular open porch, quarter sawn oak trim and cabinetry. Built by a direct descendant of an original United Empire Loyalist pioneer settler of Essex County, since September 1905 the home has been a prominent location for wedding photographs as the decorative trim around the top of the porch resembles the icing on a wedding cake.

Any person may, within thirty days of the publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Kingsville notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts.
