NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Paisley intends to designate the property, including lands and building known municipally as 292 Water Street as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

- (a) 292 Water Street, Pump House portion of hose tower and garage portion at the front of the hose tower.

Reasons for the Proposed Designation

The brick portion of the garage is worthy of being designated for its architectural and/or historic value. The pumphouse was built in 1887, of a rectangular yellow brick, as it was needed for a much needed waterworks system for fire protection and caused the first move towards a fire department. A steam engine, water pipes and six hydrants were installed. A well was dug in the basement of the pump house and a pipe from this well went to the Saugeen River supplying unlimited water. The hose tower was constructed a few years later. In 1946 the hose tower garage was built to house the first fire truck.

Notice of the objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Village of Paisley before the 23rd day of June, 1995.
