Pursuant to the provisions of the *Ontario Heritage Act* you are hereby served with a copy of the Notice of Intent to Designate the "Jail building" on property known as "50 Victoria Avenue North" in Lindsay, to be of historical and architectural value or interest.

You will note from the enclosed Notice that objections, if any, are to be served on the Clerk within thirty (30) days of publication of this Notice (which will first occur on Thursday, July 27<sup>th</sup>, 2000 and again on August 3 and 10<sup>th</sup>, 2000). If no objections are received, a draft by-law will be prepared and presented to Council of the Town of Lindsay for reading and possible passage on September 11, 2000.

## NOTICE OF INTENT TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Town of Lindsay hereby gives Notice of Intent to Designate the following building under the provisions of Section 29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, as a building of historical or architectural value or interest:

The exterior portion of the original Jail building of 1863 known as the Lindsay Jail and known municipally as 50 Victoria Avenue North, Lindsay, and legally described as Part Lot 13, North of Francis Street, Town of Lindsay, County of Victoria.

## **REASONS FOR DESIGNATION** are:

Historically known as the "County Gaol" the Lindsay Jail is an important historic and architectural landmark with a long history in Lindsay. In 1861 Provisional Independence was granted to the County of Victoria and Lindsay was to become the County Town. J. Storm, a noted Toronto architect drew the original plans, Mr. Kestevan was the builder. The building was completed in 1863 and is constructed of limestone and white brick in Italianate design, quite common among 19<sup>th</sup> century jails, distinguished by strong symmetrical, round headed windows.

Designation of the exterior portion of the subject building is recommended because of the aforementioned historical and architectural significance pursuant to the provisions of the *Ontario Heritage Act*.

ANY NOTICE OF OBJECTION to this designation, with reasons and relevant facts, must be served on the Clerk of the Town of Lindsay, in person or by registered mail on or before August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2000 (within thirty (30) days of first publication).
