# NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

## BRANDT'S FLOWER SHOP, 90 MAIN ST. EAST, HUNTSVILLE

*This Store is an important core building in Huntsville's Main Streetscape, as it is the end of a homogeneous row of commercial store fronts on the north side of the street.*

*Its high quality of red and buff patterned brickwork make it unique in Huntsville's commercial architecture. The store windows are still intact, containing bevelled glass in the upper sections.*

*The building was built after the fire of 1894. Until recently, it has always been a grocery store. Originally, it was operated briefly by B.P. Clarke. Then for over 55 years it was known as J.R. Boyd & Son Grocers, and run by the Boyd Family.*
