## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Cornwall on the 26th day of March, 1979, decided to designate the lands and buildings known municipally as 208 Second Street East in Cornwall, as property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974.

## STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The Cline House at 208 Second Street East, is recommended for designation as being of historical and architectural interest. This two storey residence was erected in the late 1850's for Samuel Cline, a prosperous and prominent Cornwall merchant and businessman. It remained in the Cline family for many years and in 1955 was sold to the Cornwall Public Library Board. It has served as the city's library for over 20 years. This generously proportioned and solidly built light-red brick structure was for many years one of the finest residences in Cornwall. While it has undergone many alterations and changes, its symetrical exterior facades and its interior ceiling, wall panellings, door and window mouldings and fireplace denote the superior craftsmanship of its construction and should be preserved.
