The house consists of a projecting tower-like two-storey bay, a single storey bay on the west side, multi-sloped roofs and a tall chimney. It is covered with a variety of materials that appear to be original. The house features a second storey enclosed projection above the porch with smaller windows that wrap around. The window openings appear to be original and the opening at the main front door is intact and has the original transom window. The porch has half columns on brick piers, which are also a common element of a Queen Anne style home.
