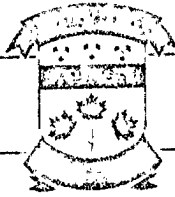

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE


TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Lanark intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980. Chapter 327.

63 George Street, Lanark

[Built in the 1880's, the old Post Office survived the fire of 1959, and stands to honour the memory of John McLean. The facade is visible on three sides from the main street, and features large four-paned windows, three-tier chimneys, clapboard siding, and unique window trim. A side dormer, added in the 1920's, is ornately shingled. Originally a general store downstairs with living quarters above and on the side, the building has served several trades over the years until again becoming a store in 1971. The boulevard sidewalk, dated 1908, attests to John McLean's profession as Post Master from 1882 to his death in 1930.]

Any person may, within thirty days of the first publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Village of Lanark notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Lanark shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
