NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Newmarket intends to designate the lands known as 154 Lorne Avenue, Part Lot 10 and Part Lot 11, Plan 55 Newmarket as in Instrument No. R733294; Town of Newmarket, Regional Municipality of York.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

The Lazenby House located at 154 Lorne Avenue is significant for historical and architectural reasons.

The Lazenby House built in 1917 is a one and one half storey residence constructed of red brick and features a stone rubble foundation. The basement does not extend under the whole house. The low slung hipped roof with wide overhang is a direct characteristic of the craftsman style. The entrance is centered on the three bay façade and is protected with a projecting gable dormer. The dormer features fish scale shingles to finish the exposed dormer and is supported by a simple architrave with larger square stone columns. The windows on the principal façade feature simple, slender casement windows with concrete sills that have been added after its initial construction. Some of the existing windows remain along with their stone sills.

Notice of Objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty days of the first date of this publication.
