City Council at its meeting held on April 6, 2009, adopted the minutes of the Community Planning and Heritage Advisory Committee meeting held on March 31, 2009 which contained the following motion:

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Owen Sound intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of cultural heritage value or interest under Part IV of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, R.S.O. 1990.

Description of the Property - The Butchart Estate, 919 5th Avenue East

The Butchart Estate is located at 919 5^{th} Avenue East, on the east side of the street, bounded by 10^{th} Street East to the north and 9^{th} Street East to the south, in the City of Owen Sound.

Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest

The Butchart Estate's design or physical values lie in it being one of the best examples of the Queen Anne Revival style of architecture in Owen Sound. Typical of this style, it features an irregular plan, with both hipped and gabled roofs, projecting and offset bays, porch and tower, and is distinguished by variety and complexity of detail. The original 1891 structure and its 1924 architecturally sympathetic addition contain materials and finishes which display a high degree of artistic merit in design and craftsmanship in construction.

The Butchart Estate has strong historical or associative value because it was built and lived in by the Butchart family for more than 60 years. D.M. Butchart was instrumental in the development of the Canadian Portland cement industry as well as Owen Sound and area's local business community. Possibly designed by Owen, Sound's premiere architects of the day, Forster and Clark, The Butchart Estate has decorative plaster work created by local craftsmen, the Miller Brothers.

The property has contextual value because The Butchart Estate is important in defining, maintaining and supporting the original character of this street – especially in light of future new construction to the north and east; and with its conversion to a popular bed & breakfast facility, it has become physically, visually and historically linked to its surroundings.

Description of the Property's Heritage Attributes

Key exterior attributes that embody the heritage value of The Butchart Estate as one of the best examples of Queen Anne Revival style architecture in Owen Sound include:

- original 2½-storey irregular plan house & 1924 addition
- truncated hip roof of house, shallow pitched hip roof of 1924 addition, gable roofs, conical tower roof & wooden shingles, including tower finial & weather vane
- multi-flue chimney shafts in red brick
- four dormers in roof attic

- all wood doors, trim & decorative painted shingles on exterior of original house, tower & 1924 addition, including two small porches on east & south façades
- all brickwork, including foundations & window & door heads & trim on original house, tower & 1924 addition
- rusticated stone of foundation, tower & window sills
- all wood sash windows of the original house, tower & 1924 addition
- curved glass of tower windows, stained, leaded, bevelled & textured glass of all windows & doors of original house, tower & 1924 addition
