NOTICES OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Town of Oakville intends to designate the properties listed below pursuant to Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act. Summaries of the reasons for the proposed designations are set out in Schedule "A" to this notice. A detailed Heritage Structure Report of each property may be obtained at the Clerk's Department, Oakville Municipal Building, 1225 Trafalgar Road during regular business hours.

Notices of objection to the proposed designations, setting out the reason for the objection and all relevant facts, may be served on the Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Oakville, within 30 days from the 28th day of October, 1992 being the date upon which this notice was first published in the Oakville Beaver newspaper.

SCHEDULE "A"

181 CHURCH STREET

Following the First World War in September, 1920, Oakville Town Council set aside \$15,000 for the first purpose built fire hall in Oakville. The building at 181 Church Street was built in 1922 and served for forty-five years as the Oakville Fire Hall.

The building displays a number of elements typical of the Queen Anne style. Some of these features include the hipped roof effect, bracket eaves and double hung windows consisting of smaller paned upper sash and larger, single paned lower sash.

Although the building has received additions and alterations to the rear and lower Church Street facade, it retains much of its original form and presence on the streetscape. The Old Fire Hall, in conjunction with the Masonic Hall and other historic buildings at the corner of Church and Thomas Streets, forms part of an historic group.
