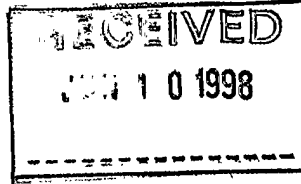

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF COBOURG

BY-LAW NUMBER 26-98

A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE LANDS AND PREMISES KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS 214 KING STREET EAST, IN THE TOWN OF COBOURG, IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO.

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18, Section 29(6) authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural and/or historical value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Cobourg has caused to be served on the owner of the lands and premises known as 214 King Street East and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Cobourg enacts as follows:

1. THAT there is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property known as 214 King Street East more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto.
2. That a copy of this by-law together with the reasons for the designation be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the land registry office.
3. THAT a copy of this by-law be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and that notice of the passing of this by-law be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality.

READ a first, second and third time and finally passed in Open Council this

**SCHEDULE "B"**

**STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR DESIGNATION**

214 King Street East, Cobourg

Built circa 1891, this Queen Anne style house was the home of George Armour, son of Chief Justice of Canada John Armour, from about 1910 to the 1930's. Queen Anne features include an irregular plan, a steeply pitched roof and the varied materials of brick cladding for the ground floor and a variety of shingles for the second floor and gables. Also featured is a variety of window design, all windows with transoms having 2 rows of small paned glass. The French windows on the ground floor are original.
