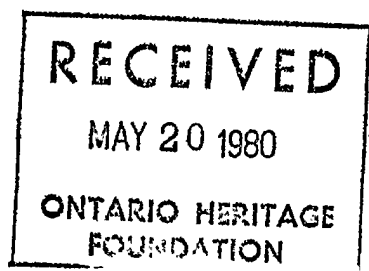


BY-LAW NUMBER 1980-69

value and interest (337-339 Trafalgar Road)


THE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The property known municipally as 337-339 Trafalgar Road
is hereby designated as a property of historic and
architectural value and interest pursuant to The Ontario
Heritage Act, 1974.
2. The property designated by this by-law is the property
described in Schedule "A" to this by-law.

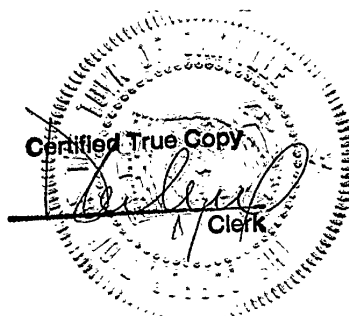

SCHEDULE "A"

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate lying and being in the Town of Oakville in the Regional Municipality of Halton, (formerly in the County of Halton), and Province of Ontario, and being composed of part of Park Lot marked "N" in the Town of Oakville according to a plan thereof drawn by R. W. Kerr, Esq., DPLS, dated First day of August, 1836 and registered the twelfth day of January, 1850, said parcel may be better known as follows, NAMELY:

COMMENCING at the most westerly angle of the said lot

THENCE NORTHEASTERLY along the northwesterly limit of the said Lot Three Hundred and Thirty-nine feet and one-half inch (339' 1/2") to a point in the said limit which point is marked by an iron pipe planted;

THENCE SOUTHEASTERLY in a straight line parallel to the northeasterly limit of the said Lot a distance of one hundred and sixty-two feet two inches (162' 2") to a point in the southeasterly limit of the said Lot, which said point is marked by an iron pipe planted;

THENCE SOUTHWESTERLY along the southeasterly limit of the said Lot three hundred and twenty-six feet and one inch (326' 1") more or less to a point in the southwesterly limit of the said Lot which point is marked by an iron pipe planted and which point is distant one hundred and sixty-four feet, ten and one-half inches (164' 10 1/2") measured along the southwesterly limit of the said Lot, in a southeasterly direction from the point of commencement

THENCE NORTHWESTERLY along the last mentioned limit of one hundred and sixty-four feet, ten and one-half inches (164' 10 1/2") to the point of commencement.

REASON FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

On the architectural grounds that it has a Step Bell-cast Mansard roof, characteristic of the French Second Empire style of the 1870's and 1880's. The tall central tower was also characteristic of the style with a beautifully constructed west facing Oriel window.
