Dear Sir:

Take notice that the Corporation of the City of Windsor intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings known municipally as 395 Pitt Street Fast as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act 1974 S.O. Chapter 122.

The reasons for the proposed designation are:

- (a) the LaFontaine House, 395 Pitt Street East is a fine example of the Second Empire Revival Style of architecture important for its roof and exterior detailing as well as its six sided plan (which is rare in Ontario and unique in Windsor) and its open central stair;
- (b) it has been occupied by four generations of the LaFontaine family.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the City of Windsor before the 2nd day of October , 1978.
