## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO REPEAL DESIGNATING BY-LAWS

Repeal Designating By-laws
Pursuant to Subsection 31 of
The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O.1990, c.18
By-law 1988-161 (25 Bronte Road)
By-law 1987-25 (47 Bronte Road), Oakville
By-law 1987-237 (2401- 2411) Ontario Street, Oakville

The buildings formerly located at 25 Bronte Road (the former Police Station), and 47 Bronte Road (the former Post Office) have been relocated to a portion of the property municipally known as 2405-2411 Ontario Street (the "heritage precinct"). The heritage precinct also contains the Glendella Inn, formerly known as 2401-2405 Ontario Street. The balance of the property is now known as 2405-2411Ontario Street and includes all three of the aforementioned heritage buildings.

On October 10, 2007, Notice of Intent to Designate was given with respect to the heritage precinct property. The repeal of By-laws 1988-161, 1987-25 and 1987-237 in conjunction with the new designation by-law would allow the removal of the original designating by-laws from title to the properties or portions of the properties which no longer include any of the buildings of cultural heritage value or interest. A new by-law will maintain the protection of the heritage buildings in their new location.

Any objection to the repeal of the designating by-laws must be filed within 30 days of January 25, 2013 being the date of publication of the notice of intention to repeal designating by-laws. Objections should be directed to the Clerk at the address listed below no later than February 25, 2013 at 4:30 p.m.
