BY-LAW NUMBER . 223.-79

A by-law of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa to designate 31 Sweetland Avenue to be of historic or architectural value or interest.

WHEREAS The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa has caused to be served upon the owner of the lands and premises known as 31 Sweetland Avenue, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in The Citizen newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa, once a week for three consecutive weeks, namely on May 12th, May 19th and May 26th, 1979;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for the designation are set out as Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the Clerk of the municipality;

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa enacts as follows:-

- There is designated as being of historic or architectural value or interest the real property, more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as 31 Sweetland Avenue.
- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Land Registry Office.
- 3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the property

described in Schedule "A", and upon the Ontario Heritage

Foundation, and to cause notice of this by-law to be published
in a newspaper having a general circulation in the City of
Ottawa.

The Schedules attached hereto and marked Schedule
"A" and Schedule "B" form part of this by-law and all notations,
references and other information contained therein shall be as
much a part of this by-law as if all the matters and information
set forth by the said schedules were all fully described herein.

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises situate, lying and being in the City of Ottawa, in the Regional Municipality of Ottawa-Carleton, in the Province of Ontario, and BEING COMPOSED OF Lot No. 6 on the east side of Sweetland Avenue according to Registered Plan No. 14349.

NOTICE OF BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on the 15th day of August 1979, enacted By-law Number 223-79 designating the lands and buildings known municipally as 31 Sweetland Avenue as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974, Chapter 122.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION:

Simard House, 31 Sweetland Avenue is recommended for designation as being of architectural interest.
