## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Tecumseth intends to designate the property, including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337.

1. The Newton Robinson United Church is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. This church was designed by John Merrick Sr., a local tradesman, and built by his son, Isaac Merrick, in 1887. It is a product of local materials and manpower. Its design is similar to many late 19th century country churches. However, it may be unique in that it is well preserved and original in much of its detail. Particularly noteworthy are the embossed metal ceiling, the original windows and the pews.

Historically, the church played a significant role in the social life of many rural people, whose accomplishments can be attributed to values received from early experiences in the church. It has become and has remained a centre for spiritual help, instruction, entertainment and comfort.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the clerk of the Township of Tecumseth before the 5th day of August, 1983.
