Re: DesLauriers Property Designation

Further to our letter of May 10, 2002, it has been brought to our attention that the wrong lot was cited in the designation of the DesLauriers property. They own two adjacent lots, and the designation should have been for Lot 23, not Lot 24 in Concession 7 EHS, Town of Mono.

Accordingly, another notice (copy enclosed) was placed in the local paper for the designation of Lot 23 and, as there have been no objections, a bylaw will now go to Council repealing the previous bylaw and designating Lot 23.

A copy of the correcting bylaw will be sent to you when it has been passed.

TOWN OF MONO PUBLIC NOTICE IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT

R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 337, Section 29 NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Mono intends to designate the property at the East Half of Lot 23, Concession 7 EHS, Town of Mono (the DesLauriers property) as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 337, Section 29.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

This is an excellent example of a red brick Ontario farm house, constructed approximately 1870, with banded brick work symmetrically arranged with Palladian fan, transom over front door and porch.

FULL CRITERIA FOR THE ABOVE DESIGNATION IS AVAILABLE IN THE TOWN OF MONO OFFICES.

ANY PERSON may, within thirty days of the first publication of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Mono notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. When a Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Mono shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report.
