A by-law of the Componetion of the City of Ottawa to designate 35 Mackay Street to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

MHEREAS The Cotario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and atructures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND UNIVERSAS the Council of the Corporation of the City of Ottawa has caused to be served upon the owner of the lands and premiers known as 35 Factory Street, rore particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in The Ottawa Citisen newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa, once a week for three consecutive wasks, namely on June 20, June 27 and July 4, 1970;

AND EMERICAS the reasons for the designation are not out as Schedule "h" hereto;

AND REMEMS no notice of objection to the said proposed designation has been served upon the Clark of the municipality:

THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa enacts as follows:-

- tectural value or interest the real property, sore particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, known as 35 Mackey Street.
- 2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property Coscribel in Schedule "A" hereto in the proper Lahl Registry Office.

- The City Clark is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served upon the owner of the property described in Schedule "A", and upon the Unterior Heritage Foundation, and to cause notice of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the City of Ottawa.
- The schedules attached hereto and marked Schedule "A" and Schedule "E" form part of this by-law and all notations, references and other information contained therein shall be as much a part of this by-law as if all the matters and information set forth by the said schedules were all fully described herein.

ALL AND SIMPLAR that dertain parcel or tract of land and proxime situate, lying and being in the City of Strawa in the Regional Municipality of Strawa-Carlaton, Province of Ontario and ANIAS COMPACED OF Lot Juster Four in Block Number Five fronting on mading Street in the City of Ottawa as shown on a plan registered in the Registry Office for Ottawa as Plan Number 15.

NOTICE OF BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on the 16th day of August, 1978, enacted By-law Number 271-78, designating the lands and buildings known municipally as 35 MacKay Street as a property of architectural and historical value or interest under The Ontario Heritage Act 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974, Chapter 122.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION:

"The two and one-half storey stone house at 35 MacKay Street is recommended for designation as being of architectural and historical value. Erected probably in 1864-65, the house is an outstanding early dwelling surviving from what was first the mill village of New Edinburgh, later to become Ottawa's first suburb. The house is a vernacular stone building of Classical character, with a central doorway, rectangular transom and side lights, a symmetrical facade with quoins, and scalloped barge boards. The house was subdivided into two dwellings in the 1870's and long occupied by tenants and white collar employees of the mills. In the 1920's the delicate porches, pillars and some interior details were added."
