The Township of Goulbourn, upon recommendation of the Goulbourn Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee, recommends that the following properties be designated under Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act:

- Kemp's Tavern Part of E2 of Lot 26, Conc. 11 (1)built in 1868, this fine example of Gothic Revival architecture is reported to be the only remaining building to survive the Great Fire of 1870 at Stittsville.
- Ashton General Store Pt. South 1 of Lot 1, (2) Concession 9
 - a focal point of the Village of Ashton, this building was built in 1879 and represents a rare example of Second Empire architecture in this region.

Gilkinson's Barn - Part of Lot 3, Concession 7 (3) this well preserved log building, built about 1910, is an excellent example of a typical barn structure found in rural Goulbourn Township. Structural details illustrate local wood-working craftsmanship. The building is a well situated landmark along the historic Forced Road near Ashton.

Owner: Mr. and Mrs. Merlin Gilkinson
Part of Lot 3, Conc. 7

— This well preserved log building, built about 1910, is an excellent example of a typical barn structure found in rural Goulbourn township. Structural details illustrate local workworking craftsmanship. The building is a well situated landmark along the historic Forced Road near Ashton.
