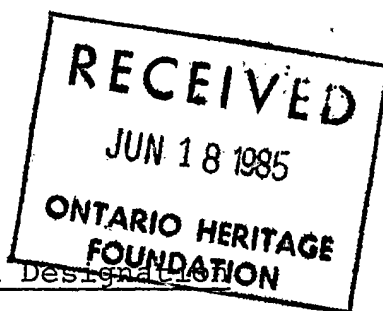

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980,  
Chapter 227, authorizes municipal councils to enact by-laws  
to designate reat property, including all buildings and


AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed

1. The lands and premises known as Part of the East half  
of Lot 26, Concession 11, Chequers Restaurant, are  
hereby designated as being of architectural and  
historic value and interest for the following  
reasons:  


① Built in 1868, this fine stone building is  
a fine example of Gothic Revival architecture.  
It is reported to be the only remaining building  
to have survived the "Great Fire of 1870" in  
the Stittsville area. The property also was  
an early hotel known locally as Kemp's Tavern  
prior to 1871.
2. The Township's solicitor is hereby authorized to  
cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against  
the subject property in the proper Land Registry  
Office.
3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of  
this by-law to be served on the Ontario Heritage  
Foundation, the owner of the subject lands and to  
cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be  
published in a newspaper having general circulation  
in the Municipality.
