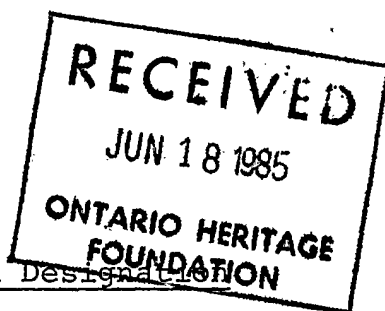

BY-LAW NO. 26-85

BEING A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY
KNOWN AS PART OF THE SOUTH HALF OF LOT 1,
CONCESSION 9, ASHTON GENERAL STORE, AS
BEING A PROPERTY OF ARCHITECTURAL AND
HISTORICAL VALUE AND INTEREST.
(DOUGLAS VILLENEUVE)

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980,
Chapter 337, authorizes municipal councils to enact by-laws
to designate real property, including all buildings and
structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value
or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the
Township of Goulbourn has served notice of its intention to
designate the property known as Part of the South half of Lot 1,
Concession 9, Ashton General Store, as a property of
architectural and historical value and interest, on the owner
of the property, the Ontario Heritage Foundation and has caused
such notice to be published in newspapers having general
circulation in the Municipality;


AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed

historic value and interest for the following reasons:


(2) This building is a focal point in the Village of
Ashton, It was built in 1879 and represents a
rare example of Second Empire architecture in the
Ottawa-Carleton region. The site is the location
of the original store built by Ashton Village
founder, John Sumner.)
2. The Township's solicitor is hereby authorized to cause
a copy of this by-law to be registered against the
subject property in the proper Land Registry Office.
3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this
by-law to be served on the Ontario Heritage Foundation,
the owner of the subject lands and to cause notice of
this by-law to be published in a newspaper having
general circulation in the Municipality.
