Enclosed herewith is the Notice of Intention to Designate served according to the act.

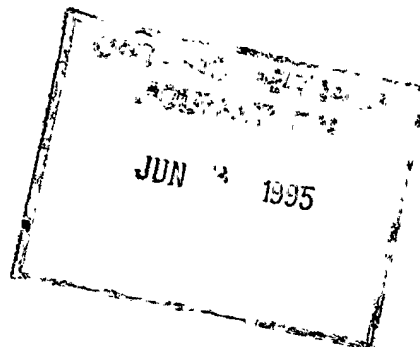

## IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT

The Corporation of the City of Ottawa on the 17th day of May, 1995, established its intention to designate the following heritage property for its architectural and historical value.

24 Springfield Road, St. Charles School

### STATEMENT OF REASON FOR DESIGNATION

1. St. Charles School is recommended for designation under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act on the basis of its architectural and historical significance. The School was constructed in 1910 and served the French Catholic population of New Edinburgh and environs until 1972. St. Charles School is an important physical reminder of the former vitality of the francophone population in this area of the City. In addition, it represents the notorious struggle for the right to teach francophone children in their native language.
2. St. Charles School is one of the last two school buildings in Ottawa designed by Moses Edey, and Francis Sullivan, two well-known Ottawa architects. Edey designed many Ottawa landmarks including the Daly Building (demolished) and the Aberdeen Pavilion.

### OBJECTIONS

Any person wishing to object to this designation may do so by letter, outlining reasons for the objections and other relevant information. These must be received by the Clerk of the City of Ottawa either by registered mail or personally delivered by the 10th day of July, 1995.
