The house is deemed to be of social and architectural interest having been a harness shop, wagon and woodworking shops. It is one of the few frame two storey buildings basically unaltered since 1850.

If such Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Bayfield shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
