



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

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THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF GOULBOURN

BYLAW NO. 75/92

Being a by-law to designate property in part of the east half of Lot 14, Concession 4, the Reilly Blacksmith Shop, as being a property of historical value and interest.

(Reilly Blacksmith Shop)

WHEREAS the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337, authorizes municipal councils to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historic value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Goulbourn has served notice of its intention to designate the property known as Part of the East Half of Lot 14, Concession 4, as a property of historical value and interest, on the owner of the property, the Ontario Heritage Foundation and has caused such notice to be published in newspapers having general circulation in the Municipality;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Township;

THEREFORE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

The blacksmith shop located in Part of the East Half of Lot 14, Concession 4, is hereby designated as being of historic value and interest for the following reasons:

The Blacksmith Shop was built in 1845 by Thomas Reilly and operated by him until 1895. His son Thomas Edward Reilly continued the blacksmith operation from 1895 to 1946. The blacksmith shop is of historical value as a surviving example of the type of structure which housed a commercial enterprise serving a rural community. The simplicity of its proportions testifies to the functional nature of the building in its role as a blacksmith shop. The building is an outstanding example of the vernacular architecture of utilized by the 19th century settlers of Goulbourn Township.

- 2. The Township's solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the subject property in the proper Land Registry Office.
- 3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the Ontario Heritage Foundation, the owner of the subject lands and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the Municipality.
