## THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF COLBORNE BY-LAW NO. 03-1992

A by-law to declare a 200 year old Carolinian Oak Tree as a "Heritage Tree"

WHEREAS the large oak tree situated on the north side of the Mill Road allowance approximately 350 metres west of the C.P.R. opposite Part 5, Plan 22 R-676 Block A, Township of Colborne, is in excess of 200 years of age;

AND WHEREAS this tree is one of the most northerly of the Carolinian Oaks located on public lands and accessible for appreciation;

AND WHEREAS the tree is of massive proportion and in a good state of health and beauty;

AND WHEREAS it would be in the public interest to maintain and protect this tree for future generations;

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF COLBORNE ENACTS A BY-LAW DECLARING THIS TREE A "HERITAGE TREE" UNDER PART 4 OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT:

Read a FIRST and SECOND time this 21st day of 3m, 199%. Read a THIRD time and finally PASSED this 21st day of 3m. , 199%.
