WHEREAS section 29 of <u>The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974</u> (R.S.O. 1980, c. 337, as amended) authorizes the council of a municipality to pass by-laws designating properties within the municipality to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton has given notice of its intention to so designate the property known as the Davidson House, located on the east side of Second Line West, south of Steeles Avenue in the City of Brampton, in accordance with the requirements of section 29(3) of the said Act;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection has been served upon the Clerk of the Corporation of the City of Brampton within the time limited for so doing, as set out in section 29(5) of the said Act;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Corporation of the City of Brampton ENACTS as follows:

1. The property known as the Davidson house and described in Schedule A to this by-law is hereby designated to be a property of historic and architectural value and interest. READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD TIME and PASSED in Open Council
