



NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Take Notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Clarington intends to designate the property, including the lands and buildings located at 68 Centre Street, Bowmanville, now in the Municipality of Clarington, as a property of architectural and historical value under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION

This vernacular Italianate house was constructed in 1871. The existing wide eaves, semi-circular headed window of the front porch and segmentally arched windows on the second floor all elements depicting its architectural style. A distinctive feature of this dwelling is its interior door casings and front window frames which have been built with decorative Italianate column trims and its architectural features are recommended for designation under the Ontario Heritage Act.

Exterior - the fieldstone foundation

- the original brick work
 - the brick window lintels
 - the semi-circular headed window

Interior - the wooden door casings of the hallway and living room - the front window casings

- the living room medallion
- the original staircase with its newel post and decoration trim

Any person may before the 23rd day of February 1996, send by Registered Mail or deliver to the Cherk of the Municipality of Clarington, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. When a notice of objection has been received, the Council of the Municipality of Clarington will refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing and report.
