THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF COPALT BY-LAW NUMBER 78-24 A BY-LAW TO DESIGNATE THE PROPERTY KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS Myle's Jewelery Store 14 Lang Street. AS BEING OF ARCHITECTURAL AND/OR HISTORICAL VALUE OR INTEREST WHEREAS section 29 of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974 authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural or historical value or interest; and WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Cobalt has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as Mylo's Jewelery Store at 14 Lang Street. and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks; and WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the clerk of the Municipality; THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Cobalt enacts as follows: 1) There is designated as being of architectural and/of historical value or interest the real property known as living Jewelery Store more particularly described in The municipal solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be registered against the property described in Schedule A hereto in the proper land 3) The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this by-law to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in the same newspaper having general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks. day of November 20th. READ A FIRST, AND SECOND TIME THIS day of Docomber 11th. READ A THIRD AND FINAL TIME THIS

Short Statement of Reasons for Designation

The Myles' Jewellry Store is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Although the original handsome frame building, constructed circa 1908, has undergone several additions and alterations, it remains one of the three buildings on Lang Street to have survived the fire of 1909 and is thus a valuable part of the Lang Street cross section of Cobalt's first decade.

Reasons for Designation

The Myles' Jewellry Store is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Constructed circa 1908 by Constant Perras, the original one and a half storey building had, by 1915, a handsome two storey shingled facade with an elaborate cornice and stringcourse and handsomely framed first floor display windows. Although the cornice has since been removed and the first floor altered, the building remains one of the three buildings on Lang Street to have survived the 1909 fire and is thus a valuable part of the Lang Street cross section of Cobalt's first decade.
