TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town
of Cobalt intends to designate the property,
including lands and buildings, at the following municipal address
as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest
under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Municipal Address: 14 Lang Street, Cobalt. Ontario.

Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The Myle's Jewellery Store is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Constructed circa 1908 by Constant Perras, the original one and a half storey building had, by 1915, a handsome two storey shingled facade with an elaborate cornice and stringcourse and handsomely framed first floor display windows. Although the cornice has since been removed and the first floor altered, the building remains one of the three buildings on Lang Street to have survived the 1909 fire and is thus a valuable part of the Lang Street cross section of Cobalt's first decade.

Notice of objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of the reasons for the objection and all relevant facts may be served on the Clerk of the Town of Cobalt before the 26th. day of October, 19 78.
