BY-LAW NO. 90-77

of the  
CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF COLLINGWOOD ,

Being a by-law to designate the property known  
as 391 Third Street as a property of architectural  
and historic value or interest.

WHEREAS Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, authorizes  
the Council of a municipality to enact by-laws to designate real  
properties including all buildings and structures thereon, to be  
of architectural or historical value or interest;

AND WHEREAS Notice of Intention to designate certain properties  
was served on the owners of the properties and on the Ontario  
Heritage Foundation on the 15th day of September 1990, and  
was published in the Enterprise-Bulletin on September 15, 1990.

AND WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designations  
has been served on the Clerk of the Town of Collingwood;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of  
Collingwood enacts as follows:

1. That 391 Third Street is designated as being of historical  
or architectural value or interest, and is more particularly  
described in Schedule "A" attached hereto;
2. The Town Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of  
this By-law and the reasons for designation to be registered  
against the property described in Schedule "A" hereto in the  
Land Registry Office at Barrie, Ontario.
3. The Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this  
By-law to be served on the owner of the property described  
in Schedule "A" hereto and on the Ontario Heritage  
Foundation and to cause notice of the passing of this By-law  
to be published in the Enterprise-Bulletin once for each of  
three consecutive weeks.
4. This By-law shall come into force and take effect upon its  
final passing.

THAT this By-law be introduced, read a first and second time and  
referred to Committee of the Whole for study this 10th day of
