TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Richmond Hill intends to designate the following property, including lands and building, as a property of historic or architectural value or interest, under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18:

Legal Description:	Lot 44, Plan 12002 Pt. Lot 45, Plan 481
Historical Reference:	The David Bridgeford House

Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

210 Richmond Street is recommended for designation for historical and architectural reasons.

The house was built for Colonel David Bridgeford, one of Richmond Hill's most colourful personages. He was a veteran of the War of 1812 and the 1837 Rebellion, and served in public positions, local politics and the Masonic Lodge.


The c1848 brick rear section is a remnant of the earliest stage of the house. The Classic Ontario frame front section was built in 1861 and altered c1906. Significant exterior features include the gable roof, centre gable, original windows and front door.
