**NOTICE OF INTENT TO DESIGNATE**

**TAKE NOTICE** that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Sarnia intends to designate the Sarnia and District Horticultural Society's property known as College Park, as being of architectural and/or historical value or interest under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O, 1990, c.O.18 as amended.

**PROPERTY:** 231 COLLEGE AVENUE NORTH - COLLEGE PARK, SARNIA

**REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION**

College Park was given to the Sarnia and District Horticultural Society by Mrs. Maude Hanna in 1947. The site has been a garden since 1927. The site once housed a 14 ft. X 26 ft. green house from which plants and flowers were grown to landscape the grounds of Sarnia's two hospitals. It is the intent of the Horticultural Society to create and implement a master plan that will renovate and refurbish the historic garden. Additional partners in the development project include Lambton Herb Society, Master Gardeners of Sarnia-Lambton, and the Urban Wildlife Committee.

**NOTE:**

Any person may, within thirty days of the publication of this Notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the City of Sarnia, notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation, together with a statement of reason for the objection and relevant facts. If such Notice of Objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Sarnia shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for hearing.
