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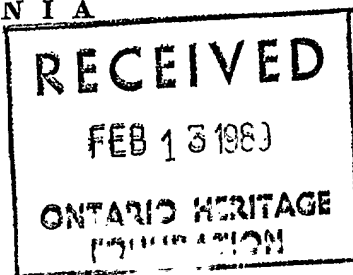

BY-LAW NUMBER 979/
OF THE CITY OF SARNIA

"A By-Law to designate the structures known municipally as the Canatara Log Cabin Complex, Sarnia, Ontario, as being of Historic or Architectural Value or Interest"

WHEREAS Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980, c. 337, authorizes the Council of a municipality to enact By-Laws to designate real property, including all the buildings and structures thereon, to be of historic or architectural value or interest;

AND WHEREAS the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the City of Sarnia has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as the Canatara Log Cabin Complex, Sarnia, Ontario, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation, notice of intention to so designate the aforesaid real property and has caused such notice of intention to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality once for each of three consecutive weeks;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for designation are set out in Schedule "B" hereto;

AND WHEREAS no notice of objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the municipality.

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the City of Sarnia enacts as follows:

1. There is designated as being of historic or architectural value or interest the real property more particularly described in Schedule "A" hereto, and known as The Canatara Log Cabin Complex, Sarnia, Ontario.
2. The City Solicitor is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-Law to be registered in the proper Land Registry Office against the lands described in Schedule "A" hereto, which are the lands affected by this By-Law.

3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this By-Law to be served upon the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation and to cause notice of this By-Law to be published for each of three consecutive weeks in a newspaper having general circulation in the City of Sarnia.

4. This By-Law comes into force and effect upon being finally passed.

FINALLY PASSED this 6th day of February, 1989.

SCHEDULE "A"

ALL AND SINGULAR that certain parcel or tract of land and premises, situate, lying and being in the City of Sarnia, in the County of Lambton and Province of Ontario and being composed of part of Lot 69, Front Concession for the City of Sarnia, County of Lambton and being more particularly described as follows:

PREMISING that the westerly limit of Lot 25, according to Registered Plan 268 for the City of Sarnia has a bearing of due North as shown on said Registered Plan and relating all bearings herein thereto.

COMMENCING at a standard iron bar planted in said Lot 69, distant 1055.10 feet westerly on a bearing measured South $82^{\circ}20'10''$ West from a standard iron bar planted at the southwest corner of said Lot 25, Registered Plan 268 for the City;

THENCE South $75^{\circ}52'10''$ West a distance of 155.0 feet to a standard iron bar planted;

THENCE North $14^{\circ}07'50''$ West a distance of 136.0 feet to a standard iron bar planted;

THENCE North $80^{\circ}17'50''$ East a distance of 155.46 feet to a standard iron bar planted;

THENCE South $14^{\circ}07'50''$ East a distance of 124.0 feet more or less to the point of commencement.

SCHEDULE "B"

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

The Log Cabin Complex consisting of the Log Cabin, Carriage Shed and Smoke House is recommended for designation for architectural and historical reasons. Some of the architectural features of these structures include fireplaces, peg flooring, cedar shingles, square log construction and brickwork.

The buildings were originally owned by Mr. & Mrs. W. J. Hanna, an M.P.P. and President of Imperial Oil.

These buildings were donated to the City by Mr. Lorne Hay, a former builder, subdivider and City Alderman. In 1971 these structures were moved, in one piece, to their present location in the vicinity of the Childrens' Farm at Canatara Park.
