

REASONS FOR DESIGNATION THE TERRACE

(a) Architectural

The Terrace is probably one of the finest examples of 19th century small-town Ontario row housing still standing in Ontario.

(b) Historical

The Terrace was built in 1857 by Robert Perry, son of Peter Perry, one of Whitby's founding fathers. The Terrace was a fashionable address for professional men and their offices until the 1930's. Noteworthy owners and residents of the Terrace include William Barnes, Dr. Wellington Adams and Robert Alexander Hutchison, Public School Inspector for South Ontario County from 1913-1943.

Any person may, before October 21, 1983, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Whitby notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of reasons for the objection and all relevant facts. If such a notice of objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for a hearing.
