

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of Prescott, on the 5th day of April 1976, decided to designate the land and building, known municipally as 201 Water Street, (Lot 13) in the Town of Prescott, at the corner of Centre Street, as a property of historical and architectural value or interest under the Ontario Heritage Act 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

REASONS FOR PROPOSED DESIGNATION:

Originally a Forwarding Trade building, 201 Water Street, corner of Centre Street (SW) - circa 1795 by unknown builder. An interesting example of a commercial structure, with a basic pattern of simplified three storey Scottish/Canadian architecture; incorporating beautiful exterior and interior moldings, rugged stone work and zestful fireplaces. It maintains its original design and fabric with a few interior alterations. The building is a local landmark and important in streetscape terms because of its position and location relative to the proposed town waterfront redevelopment.
