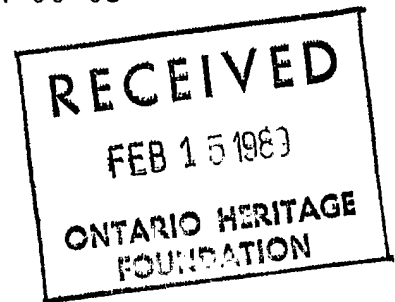

Re: Dedesignation of Certain Parts of a  
Designated Heritage Building  
Old Market Square and Town Hall Building  
Trenton, Ontario



The above noted building was designated as a heritage building by Trenton City Council on June 13, 1983 pursuant to Part IV of the Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980. The Trent Port Historical Society has recently completed a feasibility study for the restoration of the above noted building. The consultant, Mr. Peter Stokes, concluded that certain parts of the building should be removed for the proper restoration of the building.

The City Council of the Corporation would like to give notice of its intention to dedesignate certain portions of the building for the purposes of removal. A repealing by-law for the dedesignation will be presented to City Council on February 27, 1989.

The request for dedesignation came from the Trent Port Historical Society in a letter to City Council dated December 6, 1988 (copy attached). This request was based on a report to the Society from Mr. Peter Stokes (copy attached). The Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee advised Council that they should support the request (copy of letter attached).

The dedesignation will apply to additions to the building that have occurred over the years. The remaining parts of the building will include the original Market Building and Town Hall and a large south addition.


