**THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHAMPTON
BY-LAW NUMBER 3072**

A by-law to designate "The Bowden House" to be
of historic or architectural value or
interest.

WHEREAS section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, c.337 as amended authorizes the Council of a municipality to pass by-laws designating real property including all buildings and structures thereon to be of architectural or historical value or interest.

AND WHEREAS a certain parcel or tract of land and premises lying within the Town of Southampton, and known locally as "The Bowden House" has been recommended for designation as a property of historical value or interest.


AND WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Southampton has caused to be served on the owner, of the said lands and premises, and upon the Ontario Heritage Foundation a Notice of Intention to so designate the said lands and premises and has caused such Notice of Intention to be published in a newspaper having general circulation within the municipality.


AND WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Southampton within the thirty day period after the date of the publication of the said Notice of Intention.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Southampton enacts as follows:


1. That the lands and premises known as "The Bowden House" and shown as Town Plan, Part Lot 18, west of Huron Street, for the Town of Southampton, in the County of Bruce, is hereby designated as being property of historic or architectural value of interest and as such is subject to provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980 c.337.
2. That the Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Southampton is hereby authorized and instructed to;
 - (A) Cause a copy of the by-law to be registered against the said lands in the Land Registry Office for the Land Registry Division of Bruce (No.3).
 - (B) Cause a copy of the by-law to be served on the owner of the said property and on the Ontario Heritage Foundation.
 - (C) Cause a notice of the passing of this by-law to be published in a newspaper having general circulation within the municipality for three consecutive weeks.
3. That this by-law shall take effect upon the date of passage by Council and comes into force pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O., 1980.


