PUBLIC NOTICE BOARD

IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, 1974 S.O. CHAPTER 122:

And in the matter of the land and premises at the following location and municipal address in the Province of Ontario:

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Taking notice that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Smiths Falls intends to designate property including lands and building exterior at the following location and municipal address being property of architectural and historical value or interest pursuant to Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

PROPERTY PROPOSED FOR DESIGNATION

(a) Located West of Rideau Avenue and South of McCann Street on lands owned by Canadian Pacific Railway, on Registered Plan No. 1184, Part 9, Part 10 and Part 11.

REASONS FOR THE PROPOSED DESIGNATION

CPR Engine House (Roundhouse and turntable) built in 1886 this CPR Engine House and annex, a semi-circular building of concrete and stone, is the oldest section of what once was the largest Engine House between Montreal and Winnipeg. The building now consists of five radiating stalls with wooden swinging doors. The front had arched windows and doors and the back of each bay had large sectional windows consisting of 144 panes. The roof of wooden planks sloping from front to back is covered with tar and gravel. The 100 ft. turntable is one of the largest ever built in Canada and is powered by compressed air of 125 lb. pressure. The purpose of this designation is to preserve an important historic landmark for future generations.

Any person may within thirty days (Friday, September 6, 1991) of the first publication of this notice send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Smiths Falls notice of his or her objection to the proposed designation together with a statement of the reason for the objection is received, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Smiths Falls shall refer the matter to the Conservation Review Board for hearing.
