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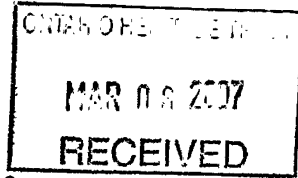

TAKE NOTICE that the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of Port Hope intends to designate property at the following municipal address as a property of architectural and/or historical value or interest, pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, Part IV.

**Reasons for the Proposed Designation**

This property is being designated because of its architectural and historical significance. The house, originally a modest vernacular workers cottage completed circa 1848, was built by Thomas Wilcock. This mid-nineteenth century cottage underwent significant modifications at the turn of the century and displays features drawn from the Arts and Crafts movement popular in the early 1900s; a dominant two-storey front facing bay window with prominent gable; decorative two panel shutters with diamond cut out; and a pebble dashed exterior finish. This house contributes to the nineteenth century character of this significant early historical neighbourhood providing an excellent example of one of the few houses in Port Hope that incorporated elements of Arts and Crafts styled houses.
