TAKE NOTICE that the Municipal Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of Port Hope intends to designate the building at the following municipal address as a property of cultural heritage value or interest, pursuant to the provisions of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter 0.18, Part IV:

The John Hatton House, 15 King Street

The John Hatton House is a two storey residential building located on the east side of King Street in Port Hope's historic neighborhood of Protestant Hill.

Statement of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest

The John Hatton House was completed circa 1834, by local merchant, John Hatton Jr. The built and cultural heritage value of this early nineteenth century dwelling is evident in its fine craftsmanship and key exterior and interior attributes that showcases the uniqueness of the building. It is a well preserved early example of a Neo-classical frame house design showcasing the unique talents of the builder.
