TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Markham intends to designate the property, including land and building, known municipally as 12 David Gohn Circle, Markham, as a property of architectural and/or historic interest or value under Part 1V of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter O.18.

A Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation of The John Jacob Lunau House is attached.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR DESIGNATION

The John Jacob Lunau House is recommended for designation under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act because of it's Architectural and Historical significance.

Historical Reasons

Joachim Lunau, an original Berczy settler, was first granted Lot 14 in Concession 3. In 1803 he exchanged for the site on Warden Avenue. In 1827, Joachim sold the lot to his youngest son John Jacob, who in turn sold to his youngest son, Silas in 1867. The 1851 census lists John Jacob Lunau on this property in a residence constructed of unburned brick. On the 1861 census, the house is described as a 1½ storey board home.

John Jacob Lunau was a reformer and a personal friend of Wm. Lyon Mackenzie. Called to participate in the 1837 rebellion, John Jacob was unable to because of his failing health. In 1862, John Jacob deeded a parcel of land on this site to the Bethel Primitive Methodist Church. Today only the Lunau cemetery marks the site of the former small frame church.

Architectural Reasons

The John Jacob Lunau house, built c. 1840-60 is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ storey Georgian style cottage with Gothic Revival elements. The exterior material is wood, vertical plank. The roof type is a medium pitch gable and the windows are rectangular with 2/2 pane division.

The front facade is three bays wide with the centre gable and main entrance door placed in a slightly asymmetrical manner. There is a gothic window on second storey with a paired 2/2 window and a single 2/2 window on either side of the main entrance. An original addition to the right side has subsequently been removed.

The centre gable with Gothic window has been restored based on an archival photograph. The bell-cast porch was re-introduced based on examination of outline on wood.

The John Jacob Lunau house was relocated to the Markham Heritage Estates subdivision in 1995 due to the construction of Highway # 407.
