
TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham on the 13th day of April, 1982, passed a motion of intention to designate the property, including lands and buildings, known municipally as 145 Main Street, Unionville, as a property of architectural and/or historic interest or value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The house located at 145 Main Street in Unionville is recommended for designation for both architectural and historical reasons. Architecturally it is an example of the survival of the Georgian style on a small domestic scale in rural areas. Historically it was built as the home of a Scottish settler and later became the home of George Eakin, the Secretary-Treasurer of the Township Council in the 1860's.

NOTICE OF OBJECTION to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty (30) days of the 28th day of April, 1982.
