
TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham on the 13th day of April, 1982, passed a motion of intention to designate the property, including lands and buildings, known municipally as 148 John Street, Thornhill, Ontario, as a property of architectural and/or historic interest or value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The David Chapman House at 148 John Street is recommended for designation for its architectural importance as a fine example of a house built in the Ontario Classic Style, displaying decorative features in the Classic Revival and Gothic Revival styles.

NOTICE OF OBJECTION to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty (30) days of the 28th day of April, 1982.
