
TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham on the 12th day of April, 1983 passed a motion of intention to designate the property, including lands and buildings, known municipally as Colty Corner's School Section No. 11 (Part of Lot 20, Concession 5), Markham, as a property of architectural and/or historic interest or value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 337

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The former school house at the intersection of Kennedy Road and Seventeenth Avenue is the oldest surviving school house in the Town of Markham. It is easily visible to the travelling public. It preserves several unique architectural features which once were common to school houses built in the 19th Century including a bell tower, eaves returns, multi-paned windows and a Regency style front verandah.

NOTICE OF OBJECTION to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty (30) days of the 4th day of May, 1983.
