NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham on the 11th day of March, 1980, passed a motion of intention to designate the property, including lands and buildings, known municipally as 4876 Steeles Avenue East, Milliken, Ontario, as a property of architectural and/or historic interest or value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

## Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation

Ebenezer United Church, built in 1877, is recommended for designation for architectural reasons as one of the more ambitious church designs undertaken to be built in that era within the Town of Markham. In style, the church is representative of a rural Gothic Revival movement which was then popular within the Province. The dichromatic brickwork (bricks of two colours) used as a decorative treatment came into vogue in Ontario in the 1870's and this building is a good example of this type of treatment.

NOTICE OF OBJECTION to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty (30) days of the 3rd day of April, 1980.
