IN THE MATTER OF THE ONTARIO HERITAGE ACT, 1974, R.S.O. CHAPTER 122

AND IN THE MATTER OF THE LANDS AND PREMISES KNOWN MUNICIPALLY AS 15 Church Lane, Thornhill, IN THE TOWN OF MARKHAM IN THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

TO: Roman Catholic Rectory, c/o Thomas Chidlow, 39 Green Lane, Thornhill, Ontario.

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham on the 14th day of February, 1978, passed a motion of intention to designate the property, including lands and buildings, known municipally as Saint Vladimir Ukranian Catholic Church Manse, 15 Church Lane, Thornhill, Ontario, as a property of architectural and/or historical interest or value under Part 1V of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, R.S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The building at 15 Church Lane, Thornhill, locally known as Saint Vladimir Ukranian Catholic Church Manse, is recommended for designation as an integral part of the ecclesiastic environment completed by the neighbouring church and cemetery. Built in 1890, it is a fine piece of Ontario vernacular architecture. The L-shaped house is of orange brick well highlighted by many courses of beige brick.

Notice of objection to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty (30) days of the 8th day of March, 1978.
