
TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Markham on the 13th day of April, 1982, passed a motion of intention to designate the property, including lands and buildings, known municipally as Highway 48 west side, Part Lot 19, Concession 7, Markham, as a property of architectural and/or historic interest or value under Part IV of The Ontario Heritage Act, 1974, S.O. Chapter 122.

Short Statement of the Reasons for the Proposed Designation:

The James Thomas House located on the west side of Highway 48, on part of Lot 19, Concession 7 in Markham is recommended for designation for architectural reasons as it is one of the few surviving houses built in a regional style seen in the Markham-Brougham area. This regional style is characterized by a two-storey rectangular house with hipped roof, featuring a "gothicized" Palladian window under a centre-front gable. Detailing on the Thomas House also shows the influence of the Regency and Georgian styles.

NOTICE OF OBJECTION to the designation may be served on the Clerk within thirty (30) days of the 28th day of April, 1982.
